


# NEWSLETTER

#### General

The houses have split into working groups and will continue to meet throughout the session. A teacher will lead each house in learning around Eco Schools, Rights Respecting Schools, Digital Leaders and Global Development Goals. We will continue to build understanding in these areas and develop what we do in school as we work towards recognition in these areas.

All crowns should be brought to school on the morning of the 5<sup>th</sup> May.

#### **Assemblies**

We hope to start a pattern of Mary the local minister coming in for assemblies again. She will be visiting us this week and we hope to see her a few more times this term and at the end of term.



#### Fun Day

Over the last few sessions we have had a whole school fun day supported by the parent council rather than a trip. This has been due to a number of factors, number of children, mix of ages and interests, covid and value for money due to increased costs all over in particular with fuel. We hope to have a fun day during the last week on **Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> July** this year and will share details from the Parent Council nearer the time.

### School Photographer

The school photographer is in school on <u>Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May</u> for individual, family and class group photos. Mrs Milne has be in touch to see who would like to bring in younger siblings. We will be using Pixel8 as our photographer again. This is a good fundraiser for the school.

#### Class 3 Trip

We are looking at a day out trip for Class 3 as part of the transition process from P6 - S1. More details will follow in the very near future. This would be with Old Rayne and Logie Durno schools to continue the building of relationships which will be a supportive factor as they move to secondary education.

#### **Transition Activities**

There will be conversations going on this term around transition for our P7. We will then move towards transition days in June which will be supported by additional days for some in the form of bridging groups. We have had a visit this term from Mr Pearce from the support for learning staff who had a conversation with the P7 group and answered some of their questions. We will also be having a visit from Community Learning and Development to see how they can support the transition.

The new primary one children will be visiting the school during this term to become familiar with the building. They have the coffee morning dates and will visit the class on the 10<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> of May and then again on the 7<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> of June. There will also be a Parent Talk in the hall on the 12<sup>th</sup> June. They are also invited to bring a picnic and join us for sports day.

#### Sports Day

We will have sports day on <u>Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June</u>. This date was originally decided before we knew the Meldrum Academy transition dates and moved to the 28<sup>th</sup> once we knew them. More detail around the day will follow nearer the time including information on how to order a school packed lunch for the day if required.

# Reports

Each class teacher will be working on reports this term and these will be issued prior to the open session in school. Issue will begin on <u>Friday 9<sup>th</sup> June</u>. The reports now come by email for GDPR reasons and this will be done slowly to ensure it is checked before sending again to avoid any data concerns. The report still has space for parental comments and this can now be sent by email return. These will be printed and stored with your child's report. If there are any concerns that require action we will be in touch regarding a meeting.





We are into term 4 and hopefully some spring like weather it would be great to have some volunteers to support gardening. This can be over a lunchtime or during class time supporting a class. If you have any interest in gardening and are willing to help with some digging and planting please let us know. Also let us know if you are a good gardener and could give us some cutting of plants that give good ground cover or will grow well along the wall to take up some of the space usually filled with nettles. We have one helper who we are very grateful for offering an hour to support children weeding and planting over lunch. This has helped stop things getting overgrown. We hope some of the bulbs we planted will start to appear soon.
